

She loves the effect of pentimento, or the concept of seeing previous layers of work and the history of the decisions made to get to a final piece which after all may not always be the final version The chaos of making mistakes and allowing technical imperfections to insist on their place in the final work a e treasured aspects of Mimi's process.

Mimi Young's interest lies in the essential element of an artist's practice:


a sense of play






