The Woodstock Artists Association & Museum Announces Far & Wide National June 7 - August 11, 2024 Opening Reception: Saturday, June 8, 4-6pm







(Woodstock, NY) – The Woodstock Artists Association & Museum is pleased to announce *Far & Wide National*, on view from June 7 through August 11, 2024 in the Main Gallery. This group exhibition was juried by Jane Eckert, Founding Director of Eckert Fine Art in Washington Depot, CT. WAAM will host a public reception to celebrate the opening of a new round of exhibitions on Saturday, June 8 from 4-6pm.

Far & Wide is an annual exhibition and the one time each year that WAAM calls for submissions from artists throughout the country rather than from the Woodstock region alone. The exhibition features work by 46 artists who were chosen by the juror for their demonstration of exceptional talent. Works of varying styles and mediums are included, from collage, photography and painting to prints and mixed media works. This survey of diverse works provides visitors with the unique opportunity to experience WAAM's programming within a broader, national context.

ABOUT THE JUROR

Jane Coats Eckert is Founding Director of Eckert Fine Arts. In 1996 Eckert Fine Art opened a gallery in Naples, Florida where Jane formed a business relationship and friendship with the great Robert Rauschenberg. She curated shows on Rauschenberg at museums and mounted an exhibition reuniting the artist with his *Art Car* which was delivered to the gallery from the BMW headquarters in Germany. Jane worked directly with some of the country's finest Post War and Contemporary artists including Christo, John Chamberlain, Julian Stanczyk, Robert Indiana, and James Rosenquist. In Eckert Fine Art's new location on the campus of MASS MoCA, she continues to focus on these artists as well as Sol LeWitt, James Turrell, Don Gummer, Hunt Slonem, Chizuru Morii Kaplan, Robert Cottingham and is the exclusive representative of the Realist painter, Eric Forstmann. Eckert Fine Art has placed important pieces by Roy Lichtenstein, Henry Moore, Giorgio de Chirico, Niki de Saint Phalle, Jean-Michel Basquiat, Pierre-Auguste Renoir, Thomas Hart Benton, and George Bellows with some of the world's finest museums and collectors. Eckert served as Chair of the Director's Advisory Council at MASS MoCA, as Secretary of the Fine Art Dealers Association, and was named one of the 25 Most Influential People in Litchfield County, Connecticut. She is currently Chair of the President's Circle at Hancock Shaker Village and a supporter of many national and local charities.
